S - Educational Section of Killarney Agricultural Society Fair

1. Exhibits must be the **work of the exhibitor** and made since the previous fair. Entries are not limited to school work alone (for example, home, extra-curricular clubs and organizations, etc).
2. Exhibitors may make **only one entry** in any one class; multiples in the class will be disqualified as received.
3. Please mark the **child's name and school** on the back of the entry.
4. Entry forms and exhibit tags are available from the school, the director, and the entry desk at the fair registration. Each child must have his/her own entry number to be put on tags. The fair reserves the right to open all entry tags after the judging has been completed. While the fair will take every possible precaution to secure the safety of articles sent to the fair, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting. Should any article be accidentally damaged, lost or stolen, the fair will give all assistance in their power towards its recovery but will not make any payment for the value thereof.
5. Entries are to be received at the Killarney Curling rink on the Thursday before the fair from 3:00 to 9:00 pm. and **must remain** until released by directors, Saturday at 6:30 p.m.
6. The judges reserve the right not to award a prize if the exhibit is deemed unworthy of or inappropriate to the class.
7. **Prize money** will be paid out at the Display Building on the Saturday of the Fair at **6:30** pm.
8. Entries will be picked up from **6:30** pm to **7:00**.
